MINUTES OF MEETING ALBANY-SARATOGA BASE, USSVI

Location: 23 Pleasant St., Ballston Spa Meeting Date: May 1st, 2024

The May meeting of the Albany-Saratoga Base was called to order by Base Commander Al Singleman at 1859 with 21 Base Members present and 2 guests.

- The Base muster list was made available by the Base Secretary.
- The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by the Base Chief of the Boat, Mike Lynett.
- The Base Chaplain read the opening prayer and the Bell was tolled for Boats lost during the month of May.
- The Base Chaplain remembered the late Base Member Donato "Dan"
 Persico and read the inscription from the memorial to his service in
 Amsterdam, NY. Dan was a survivor of the USS SQUALUS sinking. A scan

Old Business

- Base Commander (BC) Al Singleman reviewed the upcoming parades and event, see upcoming events section.
- The Tolling of the Boats was discussed and who would take care of certain arrangements. BC Al Singleman briefly left the meeting, to arrange for chairs to be setup, with a gentleman at the bar. After Al's return, Bill Preece and Rocky Smith volunteered to read. Bill Preece will arrange for the PA. Steve Cipperly will stop by to take care of the weeds soon. Rep. Mary Beth Walsh and Tom Tedesco will be attending.
- Jim Irwin mentioned the USS ALBANY Association ceremony on 11 May at 1100 at Rensselaer Riverfront Part at Broadway and 5th Ave in Rensselaer. The Assoc. will be visiting the Submarine Memorial and was interested to know if the numbers would be on the boat. - Float field day was discussed. Jim Stevens was not in attendance so BC Al Singleman resolved to get in touch with Jim and see what day this could happen.

New Business

- Jim Irwin discussed the presentation of the Subvets Tenacity Award at the RPI NROTC awards ceremony. The presentation went well and was well received by the awardee and the crowd.
- Jim also discussed that RPI NROTC is struggling to get people to enroll. The NROTC scholarship includes tuition and books and a stipend. RPI also foots the bill for room and board which is not the case across all NROTC schools. A good deal indeed, tell your kids/grandkids.

- Mike Lynett showed the group a sack he found that was from a WWII submarine and asked if anyone knew what it might have been used for. The group concluded it is a laundry bag that would have been dropped off on the pier and then returned to the boat. This would explain the name of the boat screen printed on the sack and the name of the sailor stenciled above the name of the boat.



Submarine Combat World War II United States USS Squalus 192 **Donato (Dan) Persico, Chief T/M**

A Survivor of the Submarine U.S.S. Squalus, which sank on May 23, 1939 off the coast of Portsmouth, NH. A faulty main induction valve caused the engine rooms to fill with sea water trapping 26 sailors who drowned. Thirty three others were in the forward section of the Submarine where watertight doors held back the water. All 33 were rescued by using a rescue bell, designed by Swede Momsen but never used until this disaster. The bell was lowered 3 times to the depth of 240 ft. and secured to an escape hatch bringing up 25 men to the surface. The bell was lowered a fourth time to bring up the remaining eight. Dan Persico, just 21 years of age, was in the last bell. Disaster struck again. The down-haul cable, attached to the bell jammed and couldn't be freed. This cable was then cut leaving the bell attached only to the surface by a single cable that became frayed except for one strand. After several attempts to attach a new cable failed, the bell was raised slowly by hand to prevent breaking the one remaining Paid strand. The final eight men were brought safely to the surface. Chief Persico received the Bronze Star, the Submarine Combat Pin, and Battle Stars during World War II. He also served in the Korean Conflict. When Dan

retired from the U.S. Navy he returned to Amsterdam, NY where he lived.

Donato (Dan) Persico died on January 26, 2001.

3act: A submarine has a higher percentage of rated men than any other type of ship in the Navy.

Jact: The accepted pronunciation of submariner in the Navy is subMARiner—with the accent on the "MAR" and with the "A" sounded as in fact.

Jact: Three types of warning are used in a submarine. The diving and surfacing alarms are sounded on a klaxon. The collision alarm is sounded by means of a siren. The general alarm is sounded on a system of bells.

Jact: Compressed air is used so extensively in a submarine because it allows such a large amount of power to be stored in a small space with minimum weight and because it is excellently adapted to use in a submerged vessel.
