

U.S. Submarine Veterans, Inc. Albany-Saratoga Base

Location: American Legion Henry Cornell Post 234 23 Pleasant Street, Ballston Spa, NY

Minutes from 08 Jan 2014 meeting

1900 hours: regular meeting called to order by CDR Irwin, 17 members present.

- Chief of the Boat AI Singleman led the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance to the US Flag.
- Ten-Hut! As of Jan 2014, Albany-Saratoga Base now has 122 members!
- We have a new associate member! Welcome Aboard mate! Arthur Nolan!
- CDR Irwin offered an opening prayer, gave the invocation and tolled the bell for *boats lost during the month of January.*

USS S-26 (SS-131) 24 Jan 1942 – 46 died. In Gulf of Panama, S-26 was proceeding from Balboa, C.Z. to its patrol station in company with S-21, S-29 and S-44 and an escort vessel, PC-460. At 2210 hours, the escort vessel sent a visual message to the submarines that she was leaving the formation. S-21 was the only submarine to receive this message. Shortly thereafter PC-460 collided in the dark with S-26 on the starboard side of the torpedo room; the submarine sank within a few seconds. Only three of the four men on the bridge survived.

USS Argonaut (APS-1) 10 Jan 1943 – 104 killed. Sunk by aircraft (582d Kokutai) and Japanese destroyers Isokaze and Maikaze southeast of New Britain in Solomon Sea. At the time, she was the largest submarine in the U.S. Navy, until the advent of nuclear submarines in the 1950s. Designed as a minelayer, *Argonaut* was 385 feet long and displaced 2,710 tons (4,080 submerged), with 4-21" torpedo tubes forward, and two minelaying tubes aft. She also carried a pair of 6"/53-calibre deck guns, one forward and one aft.

USS Scorpion (SS- 278) Jan 1944 – 77 died. Cause unknown. Probably sunk by mine in Yellow or East China Sea.

USS Swordfish (SS-193) Jan 1945 - 89 killed. Possibly sunk by a mine off Okinawa on 9 January. It is now known that there were many mines planted around Okinawa, since the Japanese were expecting an Allied invasion of that island.

Minutes from the December 2013 meeting have been previously distributed to members. Motion to accept the minutes (Base member Bill Preece): seconded: Mike Lynett.

Treasurer's Report - Base Treasurer Randy Stein presented his report. Motion to accept the report: Sr. Vice CDR Tom Glenn; seconded: Base member Bill Preece.

Dues - Base: \$10.00; National: \$20.00/1 year or \$55.00/3 years, \$90.00/5 years. Consider adding \$5.00 to support USS Croaker restoration fund.

20 base members have not paid Base Dues for 2014; of those, 9 USSVI Life Members have not paid their base dues. They will become Members At Large (MAL) if not caught up; all others will lose their membership in USSVI if not paid by1/31/2014. Base Membership chair will be calling them.
