Meetings every 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the Month
Minutes from **Saturday 18 Sep 2010**meeting

1345 hours - CDR Bailey called the September meeting of the Albany-Saratoga Base to order; 19 members were present. This meeting was also the occasion for the *first annual base picnic*, held at the Navy Recreation field located on Galway Road in the Town of Milton. The base muster list was routed for all attendees to sign in. All hands saluted the colors and then recited the Pledge of Allegiance. The Base Chaplain (Janet Irwin) opened the meeting with a prayer and Tolled the Boats for the month of September.

All members present stood and stated their names, qualification date and boat(s) served on. Base member spouses also introduced themselves. We welcomed special guests Walt and Chickie Barden to the festivities; Ed Luther arrived later on - but there nonetheless!

Base Treasurer Randy Stein presented his report. A motion was made (Tom Nolan), seconded (Al McGuire) and carried to accept the financial report as presented.

Secretary verified quorum present.

Meeting minutes for the month of August were previously distributed by email or US mail. Tom Glenn's motion (seconded by John Mishoe) was carried to accept the minutes as distributed.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Our first annual base picnic was a resounding success, due in no small part to Base member Bruce Talbot's efforts, who reserved Pavilions 1 & 2 for our use, not to mention the setup of the propane gas grill and coolers. Al Singleman promptly manned the chef's duties at the grill - no time wasted there! - setting up for and grilling hamburgers, hotdogs, sausages, all provided by the base. Many tasty side dishes and desserts also arrived, provided by base member spouses who are seconded as gourmet specialists! Everyone came prepared to have a great time! We could have but never did get around to the horseshoes or volleyball all the more fun in the relaxed atmosphere - and the weather was perfect!

Vito De Leonardis - we noted with regret that our World War II vet Vito De Leonardis is now on eternal patrol. Our base turned out twelve strong for the wake held on Thursday 9 September at DeMarco Stone Funeral Home in

Guilderland. Vito's sister Victoria De Leonardis-Dice sent a gracious letter to the base extending her heartfelt thanks for our base member's attendance and ceremony recognizing Vito's extraordinary submarine service. Our base chaplain had a few words about the absence of any of Vito's history in our base archives - yea and verily, we need to get this information down for the record before the opportunity passes us by.

#### For whom the bell tolls -

Mike Lynette introduced a new business item for the base. He recently saw an obituary for a submariner down in North Carolina that caught his attention. The moving ritual of tolling the bell was extended to the funeral of the submariner. where the bell was rung every three (3) seconds while the casket was being moved. While the cortege was at a standstill, the bell was tolled every thirty (30) seconds. The final tribute was 7 (seven) to signify a life had been given. Mike strongly recommended that base members consider incorporating a similar ceremony into our base procedures. CDR Bailey commented that there would be many details to be addressed - all of which would point toward the need for a standing committee (and chairman) for that purpose. We will pursue this proposal further at our October meeting.

Fred Carlson noted that for the case where burial is at the Saratoga National Cemetery, we do not have any ritual in place for this purpose. The Base Chaplain Janet Irwin pointed out that we serve at the family's request; any ritual we would provide would need their approval in

advance. While such a final salute could be done at the cemetery, the schedule for burials is typically very tight - particularly when there is another funeral immediately following. We will place this item on the agenda for the October meeting.

Al Singleman mentioned that in the month of November, there will be a Wreaths Across America ceremony at the Saratoga National Cemetery. He plans to issue an email soon with more details. There is much to read and learn about the history of this on line at www.WreathsAcrossAmerica.org
