The U.S. Navy Band Sea Chanters Chorus April 11 at 7pm Tickets for this performance are FREE



PRESENTATIONS BY RAY

Ray Misiewicz

Ray Misiewicz worked at the Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory his entire working career. He has been at every Naval Reactors site in the United States and most of the private shipyards and vendors. He worked at all of the KAPL sites including Niskayuna NY, West Milton NY and Windsor CT. His education included New Jersey Institute of Technology, Lehigh University and Union College with a Bachelor Degree in Mechanical Engineering and a Master Degree in Engineering Science.

Ray spent most of his career in nuclear reactor design in Niskayuna but also had a number of operational jobs at the Windsor and Kesselring Sites. Some of the projects he's worked on include:

-S4G Reactor Cores, USS Triton SSRN-586, Reactor System Performance Engineer

-S3G Cores, used as the replacement core for all of those S5W Power

Plants, Reactor Performance Engineer

-S1C Reactor Cores, USS Tullibee SSN-597 & S1C Prototype, Lead Engineer Reactor Performance -D1G Prototype, Project Engineer Operations

-D1G Prototype, S3G Prototype & MARF (S7G) Prototype, Program Manager Refueling/Overhauls -AWBA Advanced Light Water Breeder Thorium Cycle Reactor (DOE), Lead Engineer Reactor Design -Advanced Fleet Core, USS Seawolf SSN-21, Manager Reactor Performance (Patent on the reactor hydraulic design)

-Next Generation Reactor, USS Virginia SSN-774, Manager Reactor Thermal and Mechanical Design -A1B Reactor Cores, USS Gerald R. Ford CVN-78, Manager Reactor Thermal and Mechanical Design -SSBNX Reactor, Ohio Replacement Submarine, Consultant

Ray's 43 years of involvement in the Naval Reactors Program gave him great respect for the US Navy personnel that man our submarines. Of course the "Silent Service" talks a lot among themselves but not much in public. Ray thought it was about time to give the public a look at what the nuclear submarine program has done. He is in his 14th year of giving presentations about nuclear subs. He has developed 14 talks that last about 75 minutes each and introduces a new one every year. So far this year, Ray has 19 talks scheduled, including an 8 week symposium at Empire State College ALL. He also talks to the Mechanical Engineering Departments at RPI and Union College. The other venues include the Saratoga Military Museum, a number of libraries, community centers and organized groups. He does not accept any gratuity for displaying his hobby but has made hundreds of new acquaintances over the years. In fact he has a 300 name e-mail library of folks who want to know about the sub program.
